


FAWN in 2024

The Food and Wellness Network (FAWN) is a Turning Points program that coordinates two food pantries: one at the Rising Sun Health Center in Olney, which is open twice a week, and one at Tilden Middle School in Southwest Philadelphia, which is open once a week. These communities are among the poorest in Philadelphia, and FAWN has become a social and nutritional pillar of these areas by distributing much-needed food, toys, clothes, and more.

of FAWN clients live in ZIP codes that predict a lower life expectancy when compared to the national average





FAWN by the numbers




Packs of diapers given away

Ratio of children, adults, and seniors in FAWN families

42% of FAWN client household members are minors, 46% are adults, and 12% are seniors.

Of the ten food pantries located near Tilden Middle School and the five pantries located near Rising Sun, FAWN is the only choice-based one. It is open more consistently than other pantries and offers an abundance of fresh produce. FAWN also works to support the community beyond just food distribution by providing household supplies, workshops held with partner organizations, and more.


